



## **Clinical Psychologist – Contract Position** **Hope RISING Clinic for Prenatal Substance Exposure**

Join our growing clinic! Be part of a dynamic, multidisciplinary team providing evaluation and evidence-based therapeutic support for children birth through 12 years with prenatal substance exposure and their families. Our model, developed in consultation with the University of Washington's FASD clinic, provides cutting-edge services and is the first of its kind in the nation. **Extensive training and support provided.**

### **Chief Responsibilities:**

- Participate in interdisciplinary FASD evaluations one day per month
- Conduct chart review and interpret previous psychological, medical, and school reports and records
- Help clients become comfortable with the examination setting and supporting family through the experience by developing rapport
- Conduct psychological testing specific for determining FASD diagnosis
- Participate in generating recommendations with multi-disciplinary team
- Provide guidance to team and family regarding school-based supports, evaluation procedures, and IEP guidance
- Complete medical evaluation report and billing notes
- Meet with parents/caregivers with interdisciplinary team to share results and recommendations
- Help family emotionally debrief from clinic experience, as needed if mental health provider is unavailable

### **Requirements/Qualifications:**

- Interest in and passion for working with children with FASD and prenatal substance exposure!
- Doctorate degree with a valid license in the state of Washington; candidates currently enrolled in a doctorate program may be considered.
- Commitment to building and strengthening equity practices.
- Bilingual preferred.
- Minimum one year of direct service experience with children and families, preferably providing trauma-informed care and working with families dealing with substance abuse and/or prenatal exposure.
- Prefer child and family counseling, crisis work, trauma-informed care, and motivational interviewing training/experience.
- Knowledge of special education regulations and IEP process
- Strong organizational skills.
- Excellent written and verbal communication abilities.
